THE CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY

BY-LAW NO. 5316

A By-law to prohibit littering of public streets.

THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY enacts as follows:

1. This By-law may be cited as "BURNABY LITTER PROHIBITION BY-LAW 1968".
2. In this By-law "public place" includes every road, square, lane, bridge, highway, park or other places which the Public has access to as a right or by invitation, express or implied.
3. No person shall:
 - (a) ~~deposit~~ deposit any garbage, glass, crockery, paper, rubbish, litter, or other material, whether liquid or solid, in any public place;
 - (b) stamp, paint, post, affix or otherwise place any placard, bill, poster, notice or advertisement in any public place without the written permission of the Municipal Council, except such formal notices as are required to be posted to inform the public on any matter pertaining to elections held in the municipality pursuant to the Federal Elections Act, the Provincial Elections Act, or the Municipal Act;
 - (c) expectorate in any public place.

4. Every person who violates any of the provisions of this By-Law, or who suffers or permits any act or thing to be done in contravention or in violation of any of the provisions of this By-law, or who neglects to do or refrains from doing anything required to be done by any of the provisions of this By-law, or who does any act or thing which violates any of the provisions of this By-law, shall be deemed to have committed an offence against this By-law and shall be liable to the penalties hereby imposed.

5. PENALTY UPON CONVICTION

Every person who commits an offence against this By-law shall upon conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding the sum of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) and costs (including the costs of the committal and conveyance to the place of imprisonment) for each offence, and in default

of payment therefor, to imprisonment to a term not exceeding thirty days.
