THE CORPORATION OF THE DISTRICT OF BURNABY  
BYLAW NO. 6816

A BYLAW to provide for the indemnification of officers and employees of the Municipality  
in legal proceedings

(Consolidated for convenience with Bylaws No. 9105, 9747, 9779, 9899 and 12210)

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The Council of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

1. This BYLAW may be cited as "BURNABY INDEMNIFICATION BYLAW 1976".
2. The Municipality will indemnify every officer and employee and member of Council against any claim for damages arising out of the performance of his duties and in addition pay legal costs incurred in any Court proceedings arising out of the claim.
3. The Council shall not seek indemnity against any officer employee or member of Council where an action of the officer employee or member of Council results in a claim for damages against the municipality by a third party unless the said officer employee or member of Council has been grossly negligent or has acted contrary to the terms and conditions of this employment or to an order given him by a person in authority over him.
4. This BYLAW applies to the persons referred to in paragraphs (d) (f) (g) (i) (j) and (k) of section 755.1(2) of the Municipal Act as though those persons were officers or employees.  
BYLAW 9779
5. An employee while acting as a director or the secretary of the Burnaby Municipal Benefit Society shall be deemed to be an employee acting in the performance of duties of employment and entitled to indemnification as an employee under this BYLAW 9899 (12210).
