## **BYLAW NO. 9527**

(Consolidated for convenience with Bylaw No. 14107)

## A BYLAW to regulate the parking of motor vehicles within parks

## \*\*\*\*\*

The Council of The Corporation of the District of Burnaby ENACTS as follows:

- 1. This BYLAW may be cited as BURNABY PARKS PARKING REGULATION BYLAW 1991.
- 2. In this BYLAW, unless the context otherwise requires,
  - (a) "Director" means the Corporation's Director Recreation and Cultural Services;
  - (b) "parking lot" means an area marked, signed, posted or otherwise designated as such,
  - (c) "park user" means a person who is in a park for the purpose of participating in a function or using or enjoying a facility therein and does not include a person who leaves a motor vehicle in a park while he or she attends at premises outside the park.
- 3. (1) No person other than a park user shall park a motor vehicle in a park, except an electric vehicle parked and charging in an electric vehicle metered space in accordance with the Burnaby Parking Meter and Electric Vehicle Charging Meter Bylaw. (BYLAW 14107)
  - (2) No person shall park a motor vehicle in a park elsewhere than, in a parking lot.
  - (3) No person shall park a motor vehicle in a park in contravention of a sign that prohibits parking or that limits the time during which a motor vehicle may be legally parked.
- 4. The Director may authorize a contractor to remove and impound any motor vehicle that is parked in violation of a provision of this BYLAW, and the owner of the motor vehicle shall pay the cost of removal and impoundment before the motor vehicle is returned to the said owner.

- 5. Notwithstanding subsection 3(1), members of the Dogwood Life Member Club may park a maximum of thirty motor vehicles in the parking lot of Central Park between the hours of 12 noon and 3 o'clock in the afternoon on the first Friday every month except during July and August, provided that the parked motor vehicles bear decals issued by the Director.
- 6. Every person who violates a provision of this BYLAW is guilty of an offence and is liable, on conviction, to a fine of ten dollars.
- 7. BYLAW Numbers 7019, 8682 and 9287, being Burnaby Central Park Parking Regulation BYLAW, Burnaby Bonsor Park Parking Regulation BYLAW and Burnaby Mountain Park Parking Regulation BYLAW, are repealed.
